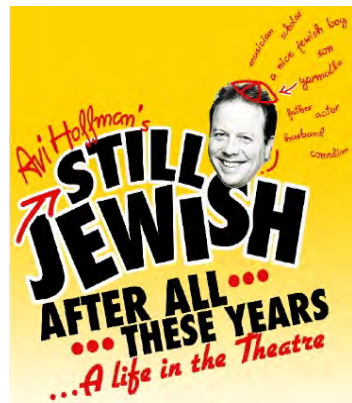

DIRECTIONS TO PENGUIN REP

7 Gickettown Road, Story Point, New York

From Rockland, Bergen & Orange Counties

- Take the Palisades Interstate Parkway to Exit 15 Gate Hill Road, Story Point.
- Make a left turn from the exit (a right turn if you're coming from the north on the IAP) onto Gate Hill Road.
- Travel 1 1/2 miles and make a left turn onto Reservoir Road (also known as RC47).
- Follow Reservoir Road until the road ends at the stop sign.
- Make a right turn onto West Main Street.
- Travel one mile and make the first left turn onto Gickettown Road. The theatre is located on the left at # 7 Gickettown Road.

From New York City & Long Island

- Cross the George Washington Bridge (upper level) and stay in the right-most lane to the Palisades Parkway.
- Follow directions above.

From Westchester & Connecticut

- Take the NY State Thruway to the Tappan Zee Bridge and cross bridge to Exit 13N (Palisades Parkway North).
- Follow directions above.

"wondrous productions"

3 years ago an empty century-old barn in Story Point, New York, became a repository of dreams as the home of Rockland County's first year-round non-profit professional theatre - the Penguin Repertory Company. Since 1977, Penguin Rep has attracted more than 250,000 audience members from the Tri-State region and beyond to our intimate converted barn. Under the leadership of founder/artistic director **Joe Brancato** and executive director Andrew McMahon, the company has originated more than 100 productions by such writers as **Lee Blessing**, **Ronald Harwood**, **Arthur Laurents**, **Warren Light**, **William Mastrosimone**, **James Sherman**, **Elizabeth Swados** and **Allan Knee**. Many of Penguin's plays have moved on to engagements in New York City, around the country and onto film, including **Kardine Leach's** *Tryst* (produced by **Morton Volkowitz**),

Warren Light's *Gimmer, Gimmer and Shine*, **Richard Valeres's** *One Shot, One Kill*, **Alan Brandt's** *2 1/2 Jews* and **James Sherman's** *From Door to Door*. The Academy Award-nominated film, *Finding Neverland* began life as a play, *The Van Vliet's Peter Pan*, which was commissioned and originally presented by Penguin Rep and the CBS TV film *The Marriage of Figaro* with **Gard Burnett** and **Walter Matthau**. Academy Award winner **Kevin Spacey** produced the staging of Lee Blessing's *Cab* Off Broadway at the Ludlow Lortel Theatre and, with **Gary Marshall**, in LA. *The New York Times* has dubbed Penguin Rep "the gutsiest little theatre" and Joe Brancato "one of America's most insightful directors." *The Journal News* wrote that Penguin Rep "continues to astonish with a consistency of taste, high-quality material and first-class production values."
